The AGM was held on Monday July 16th at the Civic Centre Newcastle. It was well attended by 77 people including guests.

The programme of events started with the chair's report, which included presentations from Elders on Housing Voices, Urgent Care, Active Voices and the Milecastle.

This was followed by a presentation of Accounts 2017-18, acceptance of the Minutes of the previous AGM and finally the Election of Trustees. After the business meeting there was a Question Time Panel, comprising of our Patron John Grundy, Professor Tom Sharf from Newcastle University, City Councillor Habib Rahman and Douglas Rennie, representing Tyne and Wear Citizens.

The panel was ably led by Professor Rose Gilroy with valid questions from the audience. Our panellists gave very thoughtful answers to our challenging questions, giving the Elders Council food for thought for its future programme.

Homes that Help: A personal and professional perspective on home adaptations

Elders Council is a partner in this research project on lived experiences of home adaptations, commissioned by the Centre for Ageing Better. The research report is now <u>available here</u>.

The Elders Council will continue to work with our partners – Northumbria University, Newcastle City Council and North Tyneside Council – to ensure that the findings from the research have an impact on policy and practice.

Activity Day - West Denton Community Centre

Elders Council took part in the Activity Day organised by Chain Reaction (Search Project) at the West Denton Community Centre on July 10th. It gave us an opportunity to network with organisations and to engage with older people living in the area.

Memoryscapes workshops

In June a number of EC members attended a very enjoyable workshop which demonstrated how certain events and places stick in the mind. Props were provided by Tyne & Wear Museums and included items from the two World Wars, the history of Newcastle United and artefacts from Roman times.

On separate tables items were viewed and comments were noted by the organisers.

The aim of this project is to influence the design of public spaces by bringing such props out of museums, so that everyone can see and touch them. Hopefully this would jog memories and stimulate ideas, apart from the Roman era! The architects responsible for the redevelopment of Northumberland St. are partners in this scheme which is why the Elders Council are taking a particular interest.

The fear is that without input from our members, new developments could easily cause important items, places and even events to be forgotten.
